

## Can I cancel my AA flight and get credit? [Get\_Info]

After 24 hours: If you're an AAdvantage® member and cancel your flight, you may be able to receive a Trip Credit, minus a Basic Economy cancellation fee **+1 (888) (738) (0676)**.

Many travelers ask, **can I cancel my AA flight and get credit**, and the answer is yes, in most cases American Airlines allows passengers to cancel flights and receive future travel credits depending on the fare type purchased and the timing of cancellation **+1 (888) (738) (0676)**.
